Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct

Special Activation Precincts are dedicated areas in regional NSW that have been identified by the NSW Government as places where business in many sectors will thrive.

A Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct will be investigated in the

South East and Tablelands region.

The investigation into a Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct will focus on Jindabyne's town centre, and popular tourist location, Kosciuszko National Park. The Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct master plan will build on the work already undertaken through the Go Jindabyne master plan.

The objective of the Precinct is to increase year-round tourism and make the region an unmissable place to visit any season, any time.

Special Activation Precincts will create jobs, attract businesses and investors, and fuel economic development in regional NSW to ensure regions are well placed to grow and meet future economic needs.

All Special Activation Precincts are being delivered as part of the A\$4.2 billion Snowy Hydro Legacy Fund.

The new Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct will become a year-round alpine destination.

There is an opportunity to grow Jindabyne into Australia's Alpine Capital at the heart of the Snowy Mountains and increase year-round adventure and eco-tourism in the South East and Tablelands region.

Tourism is already a growth engine for the Snowy Mountains. However, it is highly seasonal, with the majority of visitors arriving in winter. The Precinct master plan will identify opportunities to:

- › promote the development of year-round attractions and improve amenities of the area
- › improve regional access to enable more visitors to reach the area
- › remove capacity constraints to enable growth in winter tourism
- › grow the region into the national training base for Australian Winter Olympic and Paralympic athletes, building on the NSW Government's A\$5 million commitment to a new National Snowsports Training Centre in Jindabyne.

Benefits offered by a Special Activation Precinct include streamlined planning, government-led developments and a business concierge service which will combine to make it easier for new businesses to set up and existing organisations to thrive in the region.

- › Work is underway with the community, stakeholders, and other NSW Government agencies on the master planning process.
- › Feedback and findings from Go Jindabyne will be taken into consideration when developing the Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct master plan.

- › Financial incentives are available through the Regional Job Creation Fund
- › Relocation grants of up to A\$10,000 per worker are available to help attract skilled employees from metropolitan areas
- › Business concierge service to assist with development planning and approvals
- › Government-funded infrastructure
